



## Words from the Rabbi...

What a summer season we had on this our 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year. We had diverse programming featuring music, education, comedy, and dancing. We had a gala attended by 160 people. We had 10 beach services featuring different guitar players. Just to give you an idea of how popular our beach services are, we had 85 people at the last service of the season.(Join us next year!!). This was the year of the baby naming. We had 6 naming ceremonies, each a beautiful family.



Each service, program, or class that we do is a connection point. Each person who comes to a program or a service or a class or to just sit in the sanctuary, is a soulful connector between our past and our future. We are more than 75 years. We are thousands of years of Jewish religion and culture. Kol HaKavod (all the honor) to those who planned the summer and to those who chose to be a part of what it is that the JCC of LBI does.

As the air begins to turn crisp, the leaves change color, the days become shorter, and the activity of summer becomes a glorious memory, our attention turns to the Yamim Noraim, the Days of Awe; it is what we often call the High Holy Days. For many of us it is a moving time of year; it is a time of reflection; it is a time for positive change. Or, at least, we wish it to be this way. Try as we may, we do not always achieve our goals. But this does not give us permission to fail to make the attempt. As Rabbi Tarfon said in Pirkei Avot 2:16, "It is not up not you to finish the work, yet you are not free to avoid it."

At the JCC, Cantor Geller, I, the Ritual Committee, and the Board of Trustees, try to ensure that the High Holy Days are meaningful. Because of our location, this task may be a bit easier for us than it is for other congregations. One might wonder how hard it could be to feel close to the Holy One and to feel that positive change is possible, when you are nestled idyllically between a magnificent ocean and a peaceful bay. When a glorious sunrise is only a "set of the alarm clock" away, and a fireball sunset is right out your front door, meaning is closer at hand.

### Words from the Rabbi...

But "meaning" does not happen automatically and the impetus for positive change requires more energy than merely flicking a switch or opening a door. For me, the question becomes: "How can I ensure that this moment, provided to us by our Jewish calendar and annual cycle, is used to achieve the greatest impact upon those of us seeking renewal?"

Our goal is to create a High Holy Day experience that touches as many souls as possible. We try to be warm and inclusive while providing a broad enough experience to connect with each individual's needs at this pivotal time of the year. Some of us wish to be intellectually stimulated, some wish to be spiritually motivated, some of us want to remember the Holy Days of our past, and yet others desire the Holidays to foster a "call to action" to do good in the world.

Hopefully, the liturgy, the prayers, the melodies, and the choreography of the High Holy Day services, together with my words, will help to move and motivate us. But what else can we do to turn our attendance at services into a more meaningful, if not momentous, experience.

This year one overarching message that I will be imparting during our High Holy Day experience will be to seek out how we can be agents of positive change in our selves, our communities, and the world. Our holiday liturgy, texts, and overall structure is designed, at least in part, to help us to realize that constructive change is not only possible, but that it should be a goal we seek to achieve as we move into, and beyond, the New Year. Our ability to change is a gift from God and begins with our quintessential Jewish trait of asking questions.

In this regard, as I am wont to do, I wish to give each of us an assignment as we prepare ourselves for our High Holy Day season.

### Words from the Rabbi...

While our preparation for, and our intention during, the Holy Days has us looking at ourselves and asking important questions, I am asking you to go in a slightly different direction. I want you to consider that you are having a meeting with God. In this meeting you will have 3 questions to ask. What 3 questions will you ask God?

Your questions do not need to be limited to the Holy Days.

We may not get the answers we want, or we may not even get answers at all. But if we don't ask the questions, we have no hope of learning or comprehending. The ability to ask a good question is the beginning of finding answers or solutions.

As always, I continue to request that you seek me out to tell me what I can do to help you feel a part of our community and our Jewish tradition. Is there something you would like to learn? Is there something you would like to speak about? Is there a program or activity that you would like to participate in?

May these High Holy Days see us learning, growing, changing, thriving, healthy, happy, and asking great questions.

## AND A GREAT TIME WAS HAD BY ALL!!

The weather was spectacular. The appetizers were plentiful. The Jersey Surecats rocked the building for hours. Classic Caterers delivered a delicious kosher meal. The JCC Museum – depicting the decades long history of the JCC – its buildings, its leaders, and its rabbis – witnessed a steady stream of visitors through the evening. (If you haven't had a chance to visit the Museum, it will remain open (in the JCC library) through the upcoming holidays). What a night!

On August 10, 2025, almost 160 members and guests -- including Louis and Eric Korb (the son and grandson of Cora Korb, one of our Founders), Rabbi Micheal Meyerstein (our summer rabbi 1970-72), and three clergy from local churches -- gathered for our 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary gala.

A major theme of the evening was L'dor, V'dor – from generation to generation. A handful of Jewish families gathered in each other's homes in the 1950's to organize and collect funds to build our first JCC. Then another handful of families in the late 70's again gathered in each other's homes during the off-season leading to our JCC becoming an active year-round congregation. And when the first building became too small, another group of members came together to enable the construction of our current beautiful JCC. Today we have grown to a community of more than 330 families (the second largest faith community on LBI behind St. Francis) and our JCC is a vibrant community center.

What is clear from the JCC history is that for 75 years it has remained important (perhaps increasingly important) that there be a Jewish presence on Long Beach Island serving the island, the surrounding off-island communities, and Southern Ocean County generally. We are the generation now responsible to continuing to maintain and grow that presence. We appreciate the wonderful support that our membership provides and look forward to everyone's continued participation in the coming years, and decades! L'dor, V'dor!!





#### Sunday, October 19 @ 1:00 PM

The Jewish Museum, NY – "Afterlives: Recovering the Lost Stories of Looted Art"

During World War II, untold numbers of artworks and pieces of cultural property were stolen by Nazi forces. After the war, an estimated one million artworks and 2.5 million books were recovered. Many more were destroyed. This exhibition chronicles the layered stories of the objects that survived, exploring the circumstances of their theft, their post-war rescue, and their afterlives in museums and private collections.

Afterlives includes objects looted from Jewish collections during the war, including works by such renowned artists as Pierre Bonnard, Paul Cézanne, Marc Chagall, Gustave Courbet, Paul Klee, Franz Marc, Henri Matisse, Pablo Picasso, and Camille Pissarro. The Jewish Museum has also commissioned four contemporary artists to create new works that address the resonance of the exhibition's themes: Maria Eichhorn, Hadar Gad, Dor Guez, and Lisa Oppenheim. Treasured pieces of Judaica, including rare examples of Jewish ceremonial objects from destroyed synagogues, will also be on view, as well as rarely seen archival photographs and documents that connect the objects to history.

75 years after the Second World War, Afterlives explores how surviving artworks and other precious objects were changed by those events, and how they have moved through time, bearing witness to profound historical ruptures while also acting as enduring carriers of individual expression, knowledge, and creativity. The exhibition follows the paths taken by works of art across national borders, through military depots, and in and out of networks of collectors, looters, ideologues, and restitution organizations.



Growing up on his family's cattle farm in western Iceland, young Orri has gained an appreciation for the beauty

Rowing upon the Tigris River to enjoy a summer campfire on the tiny islands that emerged every summer, teenaged Joseph Samuels never could have imagined that these waters would soon become his only hope for freedom. At the age of 19, he was forced to leave his family behind as he smuggled out of Iraq in the secret hold of a Basra riverboat to escape the violent and repressive anti-Semitism that, over the next few years, would spell the end of the two-millennium old Iraqi Jewish community. Beyond the Rivers of Babylon follows Joe's remarkable journey, from his colorful childhood in the Old Jewish Quarter of Baghdad, to his life-altering service in the Israeli Navy, to starting a family and building a real estate empire in Montreal and Los Angeles. Blessed with a remarkably vivid memory and a keen ability to look inward, Joe paints a sensory landscape of a home that is no more, and in the process imparts the lessons of a life lived to its fullest.


